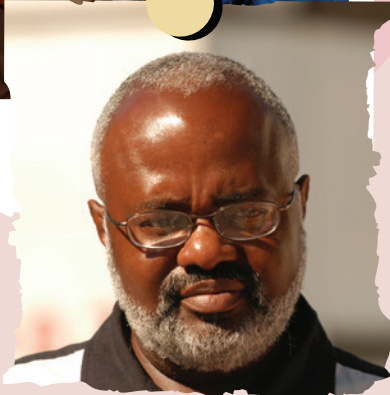

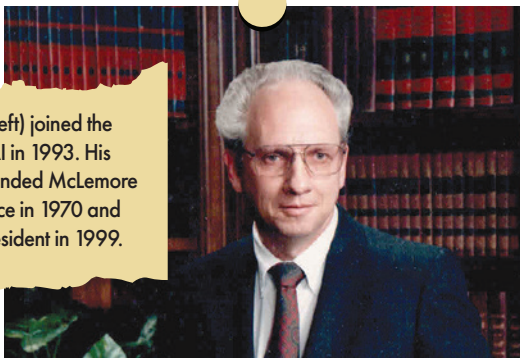
The 1977 Annual Convention featured a “relaxed atmosphere,” evidenced by the board carrying away then-President Dan Bishop.

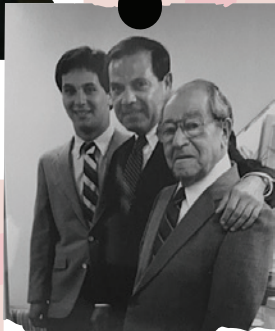

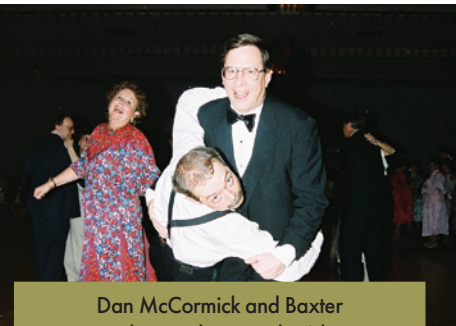
